



Walk with The Bridge: Hascombe and Hollways Heath

A lesser known part of Hascombe with fine woodland, historical interest and lovely views.

Length 3 miles; ascent 132m

- 1. Park in Hascombe in the public car park opposite the White Horse. Do not cross the road but follow the bridleway which leads out of the car park.
- After 120m turn right onto the signposted bridleway.
- After 150m bear right down to Hoe Lane (slightly downhill); do not follow the track to the left and up the hill.
- 4. After 100m follow the footpath sign up steps to the left and follow the path through the field up hill. The house on your left is Hoe farm. It was rented by Winston Churchill and his brother, Jack, in 1915 leased for the
 - summer months, Hoe Farm in Hascombe near Godalming, as a weekend retreat for their families. It was here that Winston Churchill learned to paint.
- 5. After 100m Pass through the gate and turn right up hill and cross the stile by the footpath sign. Follow the path up hill. At the top of the slope (50m) turn left following the footpath sign



- 6. When the track bears left, continue straight on until you reach a junction with a bridleway with a field beyond. Turn left on the bridleway (field now on your right). As you walk along this track, you catch glimpses of Hydons Ball to your right (1 mile to the west).
- 7. 270m after leaving the field behind and at a junction with a marked footpath,

- turn right (marked Greensand Way).
- 8. Eventually the path starts to go downhill and there is a footpath marker. **Do not** take this downhill but turn left on a path which curves round to the left and slightly uphill. Continue along this path with a slope to your right. *There is bench on the right with good views towards Blackdown*.
- Ignore the bridleway on the right marked as "Breakneck hill" and continue until you reach a footpath marker. Turn right downhill at the marker. Take care as steep in places. The track branches almost immediately - take the right hand fork.
- 10. Continue until a junction of marked paths. Turn left on the level footpath, do not continue down the hill. *There is a field on your right and views open up towards the South Downs*. After 100m, keep to the edge of the field (ignore the wire across the path) keeping the trees and bushes to your left and the field to

- your right.
- 11. Eventually the path bears left back into the woods. Ignore the footpath which goes right down the hill. Before reentering the wood, enjoy the view (right to left) of Gibbet Hill, Blackdown, Bexley Hill (Midhurst transmitter) and the South Downs.
- 12. Continue through the woods (passing under a fallen tree). There are houses on your right and Hascombe hill can be seen beyond them. Take the path to the right down to a stile with a footpath sign. Take this path and continue down hill across a field. The path then bears left parallel to the road.
- 13. Cross the road (Long Vere Barns). Take the path to the left. Continue on this path parallel to the road through a car park. Cross the road just before reaching the car park at the starting point of the walk.

Ukraine Youth Talk and Event on Sunday 20 November at Busbridge Church

"Just wow!" was one of the comments which summed up the whole event. From the suggestion of some of the

young guests from Ukraine delivering a presentation, put together from their own experience to a weekend of cooking, singing, chatting and presenting, "wow" was a great summary.

Approximately 20 Ukrainians of all



ages and a handful of Brits got together in the Old Rectory on Saturday afternoon to peel, mash, chop and prepare classic Ukrainian snacks including varenyky (like pierogi) and nalysnyky (filled crepes). Led by the amazing Antonina and translated by the lovely Vlad and Anna, we all mucked in creating vast amounts of snacks for our visitors expected on Sunday evening. A baby slept through the whole afternoon, older children played table tennis and air hockey, teenagers cooked and adults sang and shared stories, creating a community none of us would ever have expected.

Mid Sunday afternoon saw the return of the chefs who cooked up a storm while the young people rehearsed and ran through their presentation.

By 6.02pm, the church was full with people standing and sitting on the floor wherever they could find a space. Around 200 people came and heard about Ukraine's history – did you know it's been a country since 900 AD, but only gained independence 31 years ago? Or that a Queen of England originated from Ukraine? We heard

that Christmas is so important in Ukraine, its celebrated twice December 25th and January 7th (actually, its more to do with the faith you follow)! It is an important time for family and friends to get together and share food and fellowship. Four teenagers from Ukraine kept us entertained and educated us for 45 minutes. These young people expressed their fears and excitement at facing the challenges of living and learning in the UK, but were clearly

upset at leaving family and friends behind. The generosity of Godalming folk was expressed with over £1000 raised through the sale of cards and pictures designed by some of the children. The money was spent immediately on 118 warm, thick pairs of socks to be sent to Ukraine for the soldiers. It was an extremely moving and uplifting evening and our thanks go out to everyone involved in putting it all together and to everyone who attended. It was certainly an experience to remember.

We hope to continue this relationship with our Ukrainian friends in the future. There are lots of ways to help them and their hosts. If you know of someone hosting a Ukrainian, offer them some support through giving lifts or befriending; take a guest out for coffee or help them with shopping or filling in forms. 



A Word from Rev Simon Taylor

Job ad: Water walker required. High risk of getting feet wet! I'm regularly reminded in my own life that being human means we create our plans but find ourselves constantly surprised that things don't turn out as we expected. I call it a 'water walking' moment – when we realise that reality isn't what we thought it was. What matters is how we respond to those moments, and there's a great word for that response: courage. Courageous people do not give in to fear.

Courage is a big word with small steps. A child in a playground who refuses to give in to fear of a bully is courageous by going nowhere and standing firm; a parent with a child in an operating theatre is courageous by giving their trust to others to do their best for them. Courage takes many forms and it is often revealed in a water walking moment when our expectations misfire from the reality unfolding in front of us.

I was in shop in Godalming High Street recently and someone was rude and dismissive to a young person at the till. All of a sudden, courage flowed as people did not give in to fear. What did courage look like in that moment? Was it in the way the young person responded more politely than most adults might have done? Or the way another person in the queue commented to redress the situation? Or in how the rude person humbly apologised? Perhaps there were multiple water walking moments converging?

We're still in a water walking time as we enter 2023. Perhaps we forget that less than a year ago we were still wearing face masks. As a church, we took Christmas services back outside and online because Omicron covid had flared up. Within days of restrictions ending, war engulfed Ukraine. Within months, prices were spiralling. All within a year. 2022 wasn't a year that we expected and that casts a long shadow of how people seem to have become less tolerant, sharper in anger, and maybe even to take personal angst out on an unsuspecting shopkeeper.

We cannot uncreate reality as we enter 2023, but we can acknowledge that our past expectations are not what reality is like. This is an invitation into becoming water walkers into 2023 and water walkers are people of courage:

- to looking beyond what is happening now, and for me that is found only in belief in the Jesus we celebrated on December 25th;
- draw on the soul to look at who we are called to be and step away from fear and the reactions it creates in us.

This is our theme as a church for 2023, from a verse in the Bible, a verse of

timeless hope which has stood the test of 2,000 years. It involves water-walking "Immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." **Mark 6:50**

2023 – a year of water walking courage which draws us away from fear. If you'd like to know more, please join our **Alpha** course, see



Review: The Star in Witley

Did you have a flier through your door last October stating that The Star in Witley was reopened under new management? We were delighted, having a memory of a particularly good haggis, neeps and tatties one Burns Night! So we went to try out the new menu one lunchtime recently. It is impressive – not cheap, but well worth the outlay for a treat at £18 for two courses and £21 for three.

The starters, mains and desserts are very varied with some unusual – even exotic – dishes. I've always wanted to try steak tartare but haven't seen it on a menu for decades (since the BSE scare, I suppose). I thoroughly enjoyed my



first experience of it. Ed had grilled artichokes with crab butter as his starter – also pronounced delicious, as was the venison ragu with which he followed it. I had the plaice and clams with "sea vegetables" (samphire) and a spiced shellfish sauce. Extra vegetables have to be ordered separately.

There are interesting vegetarian items and several more meat and fish dishes to choose from. We both went for the honey and thyme roast plums with mascarpone and toasted almonds for our sweet course. Five other tempting puddings were on offer.

The staff were helpful and the service remarkably swift considering the number of people in the restaurant. Booking is recommended to be sure of a table at the time you require.



Warming fresh tomato soup

INGREDIENTS

6 tbsp olive oil

removed, no stalks

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

2 medium-sized red onions Good pinch of chilli flakes

2 x 400 tins chopped



Sam's latest book The Batch Cookbook is out

This is everything a winter soup should be: soothing, nourishing, gently spiced and quite simply, a hug in a bowl.

Heat the oven to 200 °C.

Brush a little olive oil over a shallow baking tray. Lay the tomatoes on the tray, cut side down. Sprinkle the crushed garlic and thyme over the tomatoes and drizzle with 3 tablespoons of olive oil. Season generously and roast for 30 minutes.

While the tomatoes are roasting, peel and halve the onions, then slice very thinly. Place the remaining olive oil, onion and chilli flakes in a big, heavy-bottomed saucepan and fry very gently, without browning, until the onions are soft and translucent. Remove from the heat.

When the tomatoes are soft and sunken. remove and allow to cool. Gently remove the skins. Discard the skins and thyme stalks. Pour the tomatoes, juice and all, from the baking tray into the onions. Add the chopped tomatoes, water and honey, and season well.

Slowly bring to the boil, then turn down the heat and simmer for 40-50 minutes, stirring every now and then. If it looks too thick, add a little more water.

Take off the heat, season to taste with salt and pepper and add a little more honey if it tastes too sharp. I like my soup chunky and rustic but if you prefer it smooth, give it a whizz with a stick blender. Serve with crusty bread and a sprinkle of extra basil.


