

A Singing Resolution

I last sang in a choral group when the fabulous Lisa Olsworth -Peter, as Music Worship Pastor, ran



the singing and baby group Sing it Out at The Old Rectory in pre-Covid times. It reminded me just how good singing is for the soul but in the wake of Covid, I haven't really done any singing since and it's been over 10 years since I've done any kind of performing, hence the New Year's Resolution.

Originally established in 1856, Godalming Choral Society is recognised as one of the most active and progressive choral societies in West Surrey, performing major and wellloved choral works, aiming to perform lesser known and even new works on occasion too. I'd known of GCS for a while and just hadn't got around to joining but in April, I finally made it to a rehearsal enlisting two friends, also keen to start singing again, to come as well. A fellow Mum at the Junior School (already with the choir) introduced us to Sam Hayes, outgoing Musical Director, we were given copies of Verdi's Requiem and warmly welcomed by our fellow sopranos as we nervously took our seats at the front.

Verdi's Requiem has long been my Mum's favourite piece to sing and those with the musical know-how understand what a huge body of music it really is, often being cited as one of the most dramatic and operatic pieces of its type ever composed. So, after a quick vocal warm up, it was a baptism of fire into the 'Dies Irae' section, arguably the most recognisable piece (and possibly the most challenging too!). Not having sung choral music for so long, to be honest, I mostly hummed my way through that first

rehearsal, as I tried to juggle reading the Latin, singing the right notes at the right time and watching the conductor!

At the interval, Sam checked in to see how we were doing and more members came to introduce themselves so that by the end of the rehearsal, we had met a cross-section of the choir and felt thoroughly welcomed, even if slightly daunted by the challenge ahead, though obviously excited too.

As the saying goes 'fake it 'til you make it', and as the weeks of rehearsing have gone by, my confidence has grown in the notes I'm singing and it's been truly joyous at more recent rehearsals, hearing all the parts come together as our conductor fine tunes us, ready for our performance on 23rd September. The complexity of the music is so moving and I've been listening lots to various recordings at home over the summer to familiarise myself more with the entire piece - for those who like music trivia (and for any Take That fans out there), I was delighted to discover, upon listening to a BBC Proms recording from 2011, that the trumpet fanfare from within Dies Irae features at the beginning of Take That's 1995 number 1 hit 'Never Forget'!

Elton John was recently quoted as saying that "being in a choir is one of the most life-affirming things you can do" and I couldn't agree more.

Needless to say, I'm really looking forward this performance at Grange Park Opera's Theatre in the Woods at West Horsley Place; it's sure to be a grand occasion to remember as we've also joined forces with the Epworth

Choir and the Horsley & Oxshott Choral If you like singing and might be Societies.

This Autumn also marks the beginning of an exciting new era for Godalming Choral Society with Paul Jeanes beginning his tenure as Musical Director. Paul studied at Trinity College of Music and the Royal College of Music, bringing over 25 years' experience in choral and orchestral directing with him.

If you like singing and might be interested in joining a choir, do come along to a rehearsal. We rehearse on Tuesday evenings (7.30-9.45pm) at the Wilfred Noyce Centre in Godalming.




Walk with The Bridge: Thorncombe Street, Winkworth and Wintershall

A walk through fields and woods with fine views of Wintershall and Thorncombe Street valley.

Length 5.4 miles; ascent 211m

- Park in Thorncombe
 Street there are a few spaces by the small village hall on the road towards Bramley. Walk south and turn right onto Alldens Lane.
- 2. After 100m turn left onto the signposted footpath.
- Turn left onto driveway down to the road and turn right along the road.
- 4. After about 100m take the footpath labelled permissive footpath this goes parallel to the road.
- 5. Rejoin the road for about 50m and then turn right on the public footpath into Winkworth Arboretum. Continue to follow the public footpath through Winkworth Arboretum right at the boathouse and then left up through Badger Bowl (no need to be a member if you keep to the path!)
- 6. Turn left out of the car park onto the public footpath by the fence.
- 7. At the road turn right onto the road for 150m and then turn left off the road onto the bridleway (tarmac).
- 8. After 330m turn left on the bridleway



(Tarmac) following signs to High Winkworth etc. Bear right after 100m and proceed downhill.

- Cross the road onto the bridleway going slightly uphill. At T junction turn left on the bridleway. Follow this as it goes uphill with fine views to your right to the hills above Hascombe.
- 10. Follow the bridleway downhill (ignoring turn to the right) until you meet the road. Turn right on road and the after 50 metres take the footpath to your left. One of the horse head sculptures can been as to your left as you continue on this footpath. Continue through a

gate into the Wintershall estate. Look out for various buildings etc. which are used in the annual Wintershall production of the Life of Christ. - e.g. the tomb of Lazarus.

- 11. Cross a track to go uphill still following the footpath signs. As you continue across a field there are houses on the right. Bear left onto a drive continuing to follow footpath and Greensand Way signs. Pass through several gates.
- At Gatestreet Farm (after pigsties on right) turn left on tarmac road. Continue to follow the Greensand Way signs.
- 13. After 500m, take footpath on left uphill between 2 fences. Follow the footpath into and through the wood.
- 14. After the wood continue on the flat and



then follow the path downhill back to your starting point in Thorncombe Street.

This year's Year 6 production was





News from the Old Godhelmian Association.

The Old Godhelmian Association, which is the alumni group of Godalming County Grammar School, is delighted to announce the publication of *Godalming County Grammar School - The School on the Hill -* a 274 page history of the Institution from its foundation in 1930 to its evolution into a Sixth Form College in 1978.

Comedian, actor and writer, **Ben Elton**, a pupil at the School in the 70s, and **Louis De Bernières**, author of the best-selling novel, *Captain Corelli's Mandolin*, have contributed to the Book.

The book's wide subject matter with history, anecdotes, photos and illustrations is of interest not only to past pupils of the School and present students of the College, but also to the general public. Fascinating personal stories and memories have been included and the chapters draw on information in newspapers, School magazines and documents in history archives and museums. A chapter on the years of the Second World War details the journey of more than 400 pupils from Sir Walter St John's Grammar School, Battersea – the Sinjuns – who were billeted in various places around Godalming and shared school facilities with

GCGS and Charterhouse School. Rod Weale has written a piece about the GCGS alumni who were killed in the Second World War.

David: What is your vision for your role at Busbridge?


Marcus: I would love to see children and families encourage and equipped to know and encounter Jesus in their everyday lives.

From the Archives - Brighton Road and Busbridge Church in 1928





Leek, Taleggio and Gnocchi Gratin by Elizabeth Silver



This is a perfect supper dish, quick, comforting and very tasty!

- 1. Preheat oven to 200° C (180° C in fan oven) /Gas Mark 6.
- 2. In an ovenproof skillet* over a medium heat melt the butter and add the leeks. Stirring occasionally sauté the leeks until softened but not browned.
 - 3. Add the crushed garlic and chopped sage and stir for 1-2 minutes.
 - 4. Remove from the heat and pour in the cream and add the Taleggio chunks and gnocchi.
 - 5. Add the grated nutmeg and half the grated Parmesan cheese, season to taste and gently stir to combine all ingredients.
 - 6. Sprinkle over the pine kernels and remaining Parmesan cheese and place in the oven.
 - 7. Bake for 25-30 minutes until bubbling and golden brown.

*if you don't have an oven proof skillet then you can use a frying pan and transfer the ingredients at point 5 to a greased oven proof dish just before the final sprinkle of pine kernels and Parmesan cheese and bake in the oven.



The Peace Bell

The chimes of the clock at Ladywell Convent are a familiar sound to those living in the Tuesley Lane area of Busbridge. But, for those living closer to the infant school, junior school, and Busbridge Church (not to mention the Yew Tree Café) another bell can be heard. It is the bell of Busbridge Church, rung every day at about 5 o'clock. Have you heard it? And have you wondered who rings it and why?

Towards the end of 2014, when the forces of Islamic State were on the point of overrunning both Syria and Iraq, and making headway in several West African countries, an idea came to Dr Chris Jagger. He decided to state a case for peace in these areas, with a particular focus against the supplying of deadly weapons to countries where they might be used against defenceless people (his pictures of devastation in Yemen come to mind). His aim was to pray for all leaders of terrorist organizations, marking this aim by ringing the Busbridge Church bell five times every day at 5 p.m. With the blessing of our Rector Simon Taylor the bell-ringing continued throughout the pandemic, and continues still. However, Chris and Maggie's departure for the Isle of Wight has left a hole in the team. We cannot continue on a regular basis without more people, particularly in the winter time when it is dark around the church at 5 p.m. I ask one simple question: would you like to continue to



hear the bell at 5 p.m. every day, as a reminder to pray for peace? Would you like to become one of the people who rings the bell and prays in the church at that time? If so, please contact the church office on 01483 421267 or church.office@bhcgodalming.org

A word from Rev. Simon Taylor

I've had a 3 month sabbatical, during which I walked part of the South West Coastal Path. Walking is a great way to see things from a different perspective. One of the joys of walking was that I had no destination to reach at a set time

The people I encountered on my walk were unique and great to talk to. Each person had a different story about why they were there. No-one judged anyone, even if some people were well equipped and others looked like they had little idea of what was ahead! In the differences, there was something in common. Almost everyone I met was following a common path. Of course, some wandered a bit to the left or right but wandering too far often led towards a ledge. It reminded me of the Life of Brian where everyone chimes in unison "we are all individuals!" Each walker was individually looking for a path and all of us eventually ended up followed the one laid down over centuries because that was clearly the way to go. Sometimes, the old ways are the best, but we fail to see what they offer because we desire a new path.

I once helped with a course for those who wanted to know whether Christianity had anything to offer them (Alpha - do consider it). An older person joined the course and towards the end he expressed surprise about two things. The first was that he wasn't being told what he had to think but invited to discuss what the Christian walk looks like. He'd assumed it would be irrelevant, but he'd found the opposite. His second surprise was that he'd come to explore this way so late in life. He'd tried all sorts of things, including the corporate ladder and various spiritualities. He'd been successful on so many life-levels, but he expressed regret that he'd come to



church last rather than first. I explained that this is common. People often arrive at the Christian path last because they've exhausted all the others.

There was one point on my walk when I became aware that there was a physical walk going on, and something spiritual. I was praying as I walked. As I prayed I noticed something. One place was full of the friendliest people imaginable. As I walked somewhere else, very few people acknowledged me. One place was the epitome of kindness but the other place was distant and seemingly cold. How could two places, so close to one another. have a different sense to them? Perhaps places have a spirituality as well as physical features? I am sure that we've all experienced this, though we may not have seen it as Christian or spiritual. There are welcoming homes and unwelcoming homes. People who

spiritual. There are welcoming homes and unwelcoming homes. People who attract and people who repel. There are good acts and there are acts of evil which seemingly come from nowhere. There are places where God is sensed as present, and this is what Godalming Minster is about as our eyes are opened, like that older man, to the possibility that there is an ancient way of Christ that can be explored. It is about seeing that "Surely, the Lord is in this place, and I was unaware of it". (Genesis 28:16)




