

New Multi Use Games Area opens at Busbridge Junior School

This Autumn saw the launch of the new MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) facility at Busbridge Junior School. The 30 x 20 metre fully-fenced pitch (with goal recesses at either end) has a needlepunch synthetic surface that is suitable for a variety of sports. On Tuesday 26th September, the Mayor of Godalming, Cllr Adam Duce, attended to officially launch the new sports facility with staff, Governors, parents and representatives from Godalming Town Council also present at the ceremony (see picture opposite).

Richard Catchpole, Headteacher, said 'We are so enjoying our brand new BJS MUGA. It's only been in use since the start of this term but already it has proved to be a massive hit with children, staff and sports club leaders. It has provided us with exactly what we wanted: a safe, reliable, contained area in which the children can enjoy being active and develop their sports skills. When the wet and wintery

weather arrives, we will appreciate it even more. Huge, huge thanks to all who invested time, money and expertise into realising the dream. An amazing team effort. Champion!'

The project, which began in 2021, cost over £160,000 with Godalming Town Council providing a grant of £125,000, as part of the Community Infrastructure Levy fund, with further funds of more than £37,000 being raised by the PTA, Friends of Busbridge Junior School.

Excitingly, this new facility is now available for hire by the wider local community. Available on weekdays (4.30-9pm) and at weekends (9am-5pm), prices start at £20 per hour. Property to sell in Godalming or the Villages?



Tintinnabulation


Never heard of this? I'm not surprised, nor had I. It's nothing to do with a small French cartoon character and his little dog Snowy! I only came across this word when I joined the Lammas Handbell Ringers a few years ago. It means the art of handbell ringing, as opposed to campanology which refers to tower bells. The two are very different. "Getting to know the ropes" may be a nautical term but is also appropriate for tower bell ringing as well as being used metaphorically for learning any new skill.

Tower bells, rather obviously, remain in place, and campanologists travel to various churches to ring "changes" (because the order in which you pull your particular rope does change, so you have to remember which bell you follow as the pattern proceeds). The church kneeler below from Lenham, Kent, illustrates change ringing. In contrast, tintinabulists have to carry all their equipment to the venue where they are playing. We need sturdy collapsible tables on

which to set out our gear, on top of which we lay thick foam cushions to protect the very valuable bells, overlain by colourful drapes if we are performing in a concert at a handbell gettogether with other groups in the S.E. Region or even at a

national rally under the auspices of the HRGB (Handbell Ringers of Great Britain) or for a WI group or care home etc. The photo shows me at Ramster Gardens Christmas fair. In front of each position we set up "risers" i.e. music stands to prop up the music folders at a suitable angle. Each player may have four bells to cover the naturals, sharps and flats of the various keys. For example, I usually ring the F, F#, G and G# above middle C.

Some arrangements require the



use of "chimes" which are metal tubes, square in cross-section, with clappers attached which make a more reverberant sound than bells. Sometimes we are required to strike the bells with "mallets" which are like drumsticks with large globular ends and give a crisp, staccato sound. We say - only half-jokingly that setting up the equipment is our weekly work-out as some of the gear, like a box of bells or chimes, is very heavy.

We play arrangements of various types of music, from classical tunes by famous composers such as Beethoven, Handel and Strauss to folk tunes such as the Skye Boat Song and All Through the Night and

traditional oriental tunes, and from hymn tunes to pop songs. So the music is very varied and can be set for 2. 3 or 5 octaves. The music is written out on the well-known treble and bass clefs with notation the same as for choral singing or orchestral music, the difference being that we are kept on our toes by having to follow carefully and only ringing our particular bell(s) or chimes(s) at exactly the right moment. There are additional signs to watch out for, such as • or + indicating use of mallet or a filledin little v sign meaning "martellato" i.e. strike the bell into the cushion to give a "stopped" sound, or "sh" or a wiggly line to indicate shaking



the bell to and fro to give a trill sound. So handbell ringing gives one a mental as well as physical work-out: very good for those of us who want their ageing brains to keep functioning well!

The Lammas Ringers are composed of up to a dozen friendly people and we rehearse on Thursday evenings between 6 and 8 pm at St Peter and Paul Church Octagon. We'd be delighted if anyone would like to join us. For more3 information see https://parishofgodalming.org.uk/lammas-handbell-ringers/



Llanaway Homes is a small Almshouse Charity which owns a semi-detached property at 11 and 13 Meadrow in Godalming. There are currently five Trustees one of whom currently acts as the Clerk. The Board are looking for new Trustees and for a new Clerk.

Criteria

Applicants should preferably be from the Godalming or Farncombe areas. Applicants to be Trustees do not require prior Charity Board experience but successful applicants should be able to work to effectively as part of a small team. Applications from those with a background in law, finance, housing, social care and community work are particularly welcome.

The Board meets twice a year and makes a visit to the properties once a year. Trustee roles are voluntary and unremunerated.

The Clerk looks after any day-to-day matters that may arise and are the concern of the Charity as Landlord for the properties. He or she is the prime contact with the Charity Commission and keeps the Charity Commission records updated for changes in Trustees and annual finance results. Applicants to be the Clerk should have good administrative, financial and IT skills. Strong interpersonal skills are essential.

The Clerk is not employed by the Charity but in recognition of the work undertaken the Charity may make a gift (Honorarium) to the Clerk. The level of this Honorarium was most recently £1,000. The Clerk is reimbursed for all expenditure necessary to perform the role.

The Clerk is usually also one of the Trustees but that is not a requirement.

Kate Winslet visits Green Hub teen garden in Milford

The Green Hub project in Milford was featured in the July / August 2022 edition of The Bridge

Green Hub first connected with Kate Winslet last December, after watching her powerful 'I Am Ruth' drama about a mother coping with her teenage daughter's mental health breakdown. She and the programme went on to win two BAFTA awards.

Critically, it was filmed on location in Godalming and the synergy with the work that Green Hub is doing with teenagers and parents was potent. The team just knew

they needed to connect with her and so asked everyone on their contact list if they could help them to make contact ... less than three days after it was broadcast, Kate got in touch.

Kate's filming commitments made a visit earlier in the year impossible but, on Thursday 7th September, she drove up to see the Milford garden to meet with co-founders Tone Tellefsen Hughes and Vanessa Lanham-Day.

Commenting on how the meet up went, Vanessa said, "Kate is very connected with nature and loves to grow things at home; she especially enjoyed walking around the garden and spotting our various tomato, squash and courgette species! Kate is a



delightful and authentic woman and is very engaged in the discussion about the teenage



mental health crisis - we were definitely pushing against an open door."

The three discussed a number of future projects, as well as her being happy to share many of her key connections with the Green Hub.

Kate Winslet commented; "By supporting Green Hub, I sincerely hope I can help to elevate their profile and raise further awareness of this deeply important issue."

As Tone explained; "What we learned in our time together is that Kate understands that she has the power to make people pay attention. Her programme - I Am Ruth - focussed on telephone and social media addiction; however, the journey for teens and parents alike is little different whichever anxiety is in play. Like us, she is committed to helping people understand the options available to help teens in crisis, via both traditional and alternative approaches."

Spicy Butternut Squash Soup by Elizabeth Silver



Warming, spicy and nutritious, this soup is perfect comfort food for these shorter, chilly Autumnal days and is equally good made with Pumpkin!

- 1. In a large saucepan heat the olive oil and add the onion, carrot and celery and sauté to soften without browning.
- 2. Add the diced Butternut squash flesh and sauté for 3-4 minutes until softened. Stir in the crushed garlic.
- 3. Stir in the spices and dried herbs and cook for 1-2 minutes. Add the potato chunks.
- 4. Pour in the coconut milk and top up to 3/4 full with vegetable stock stirring gently.
- 5. Bring to the boil and gently simmer until the vegetables are cooked and softened.
- 6. Puree until smooth with a hand blender or in a liquidiser. Adjust consistency according to preference with extra vegetable stock and add seasoning to taste. Bring back to a simmer to heat through.

To roast the Butternut squash seeds to give a lovely crunchy garnish for the soup, remove all stringy fibres from the seeds, rinse with water and pat dry. Place on a baking trav and drizzle over olive oil. Add salt flakes and freshly ground black pepper and toss the seeds in the oil to fully coat. Cook at 180oC for about 5 minutes or until golden brown and roasted in appearance.

When the hot soup is served in bowls. sprinkle with the roasted seeds and an extra drizzle of olive oil or chilli oil and garnish with sprigs of fresh parsley and freshly ground black pepper.

A word from Rev. Patrick Samuels

In this November / December edition we include information about our Christmas services and the season of Advent which precedes it. In our services during Advent we will be lighting Advent candles and decorating houses and other buildings with Advent wreaths.

The Advent wreath is a beautiful symbol of the eternity of Christ and his presence in our lives. As a symbol, however, apart from being lit on each of the Sundays of Advent, the deeper meaning held within each of those candles is often lost or

unacknowledged. This is a pity because there is a richness in the wreath which offers a real opportunity for reflecting in a prayerful way this beautiful season of preparation for Christmas.

The Advent Wreath - Its design comes from the customs of the pre-Christian Germanic and Scandinavian cultures, where candles and greenery were used as symbols of light and life during the dark and cold winter. Over time each candle was given a name and linked to a particular part of the Advent story. The evergreen symbolises renewal and the circular shape the completeness of God.

Candle 1. the first one represents God's people and is considered as the Candle of *Hope*.

Candle 2. the second one represents The Old Testament Prophets and is considered as the Candle of **Peace**.

Candle 3. the third one represents John the Baptist and is considered as



the Candle of Love.

Candle 4. fourth one represents Mary the Mother of Jesus and is considered as the Candle of **Jov**.

Candle 5. the fifth one represents the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus is seen as 'The Light of the World'.

Isaiah reminds us that, we are waiting for the coming of the Messiah, wonderful counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Therefore, focusing on the Candle of Peace, let the focus of our prayers in the new Year be for Peace in our

World, Peace in our lives and Peace in our hearts. Amen!





Mechanics for Africa is a Christian technical college in the Zambian city of Ndola. It trains young people from some of 7ambia's poorest communities in automotive engineering. equipping them with a trade and essential life skills. It was set up in 2002 by members of



Milford Baptist Church with support from friends at **Busbridge church**.

In April our deputy chair of the trustees Susie Mooney visited the college for graduation; these are her reflections:

Graduation day was full of excitement and a realisation of what had been achieved. I lost track of the number of times students told me that, 'MfA has transformed my life' and the family members who took this further in expressing how the impact of the transformation extended to the wider family. The expression of deep appreciation for our generous sponsors was heartfelt.

Visiting some of the student's homes and families was both a privilege and a challenge, seeing living conditions we just don't see in the UK. I realised how important the basic facilities MfA offers our students are, like freely available running water and showers. The distance some of our students walk to the college - taking up to two hours - demonstrated the necessity of the college's provision of a nutritious. filling

lunch time meal. For many of our students this is their only meal of the day.

Visiting students on work placement was a joy; to witness the impact that regular, paid employment brings, and to see them as the living embodiment of our aspiration to equip students with 'Skills for Life'.

My visit showed me that MfA is so much more than a successful technical college, it equips our students to learn key life skills, values, and respect for themselves and others. Throughout their two years with us they mature, grow in strength of character and explore the Christian faith. As the graduates said themselves, they leave transformed people.

Our latest news is that in 2024 Mechanics for Africa plans to open a new Computer Centre. Thanks to a generous supporter we have "broken ground" and builders are working hard to complete the development of two new classrooms in time for the start of the new academic year. In order to prepare and settle our internal works


