The Launch of Godalming Minster

Sunday 14 January witnessed a historic moment for the Godalming area as Bishop Andrew Watson led a service at the new Godalming Minster on Godalming's Church Street.

Local police, school leaders, voluntary group leaders, MP for Southwest Surrey Jeremy Hunt, the Mayors of Waverley and Godalming, local councillors and the Lord Lieutenant of Surrey Michael Molyneux joined Rector Simon Taylor, the Bishops of Guildford and Dorking and the clergy team in a procession from the Pepperpot to the church before the service started.

Associate Vicar Sheila Samuels opened the service and there followed an hour of worship with a diversity of styles. From roof-raising choral anthems and rousing hymns led by the choir, to foot-tapping worship songs led by Rev Simon Willetts and the band, the music provided the lift-off. While the children left for some lively and engaging prayer activity, Bishop Andrew gave a sermon sharing about the sacrifice and risk undertaken by the parishes involved in forming Godalming Minster and the need for us

to centre our lives around Jesus.
Community leaders were invited to
welcome the Minster to Godalming and
shared their commitment to work
together for the good of the
community.

The Mayor of Godalming, Adam Duce, commented that he'd not been in a service quite like it! The children returned to let off 50 giant party poppers (see picture, right) and enjoy the cake.

The Minster Launch service took place in one of the oldest, and certainly largest buildings in Godalming. St Peter & St Paul's is a historic landmark which will inevitably be the flagship for Godalming Minster. But the Minster is not about one building or even the four churches that it unites.

The adage that "the whole is greater than the sum of the parts" is fitting, as each church, hosting multiple congregations and sharing Jesus' care





and love in the community will be just as much Godalming Minster.

St Peter's Hambledon has been at the centre of its rural community, emitting God's love and teaching to its special village for centuries; Busbridge Church Brighton Road is known for its vibrant and contemporary approach to worship and spirituality; and St Mark's Franklyn Road runs the Godalming Foodbank. St Mark's also celebrates 90 years of service this year at the heart of Ockford Ridge and Aaron's Hill.

So, Godalming Minster is a community, sharing the goal to serve the community and lead people to follow Jesus, love people and refresh what it means to be church.

What is a Minster?

For 1,000 years Minsters served wide areas with a heart for God's mission to care for all people. A Minster was a dynamic innovative community of Christian worship, rooted in Scripture and showing love and compassion. Ministers were hospitals, supported the local economy, developed pubs for safe low alcohol drinking, provided education, community support and

alleviated poverty. They preached Christ and lived it daily around a pattern of prayer and praise.

What is your Godalming Minster?

Godalming Minster is a centre of love

and care, serving and creating community, well-being and hospitality, breaking down barriers; spiritual nourishment and teaching about the uniqueness of Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit and God our loving Father. Lent Reflection

Lent has come early this year, a season which coincides with springtime, the rebirth of nature and new life and precedes Easter

When Easter is later we might be irritated to see the New year displays in shops appear with eggs. But this year no sooner have we celebrated Christmas and New year we are thrown into pancakes, Valentine's day, chocolate eggs and rabbits.

As though this was not enough to remind us that seasons have changed quickly, we have delivery vans as a common feature in our everyday. They remind us that we live in in an 'instant world' where we can order anything well require at the touch of a button and it can be on our doorstep by 10pm the same day or the next day. The season of Lent invites Christians to slow down and stay awhile with Jesus in the desert place where we take stock of our spiritual health and well-being. Lent is a time of reflection, sacrifice, and spiritual growth. It is the period of 40 days leading up to Easter Sunday which commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Walk with the Bridge: Hydons Ball, Enton and Hambledon

An interesting walk through woods and sandy heath land with good views. Note this walk can be muddy, depending on the time of year and recent weather.

Length 6 miles Ascent 228m

- Park in Shamley Green near the crossroads by the Red Lion pub (Woodhill lane) - https://w3w.co/ freezers.boards.plump.
- 2. Walk east along Woodhill lane way from the main road. Take second footpath on left (sign for "Shamley Wood Estate"). Turn right over stile onto footpath once you reach the iron gates, onto public footpath.
- Pass through kissing gate onto narrow path with hedge on right. At junction bear left up hill on bridleway.
- 4. At the top turn right on bridleway between 2 wooden fences. Continue on path which follows a ridge. After a barn if you look to the left and you can see St Martha's. On the right there is a

former sand quarry.

- As you approach a road, turn right off bridleway past gate to the road. Cross the road and continue along the bridleway. There are drives to the right and woodland to the left.
- 6. Turn left at Mayor House farm (just after wagon wheel) onto footpath with stables to right and left. Footpath takes you slightly to the right and on marked path between fields. *Note views of North Downs ahead to left.*
- 7. Path ends at stile partly hidden by holly bushes. Climb over stile and cross sunken lane onto footpath.
- 8. At road turn left then almost immediately right onto footpath. Cross



- another sunken lane following footpath sign and continue downhill.
- 9. Cross small wooden bridge over tiny stream and turn right onto bridleway. Continue on the bridleway for about 1400m ignoring crossing paths and continue uphill eventually passing some ponds.
- 10. At junction where there is a sign saying private straight on, take right turn uphill following yellow footpath sign.
- 11. As the path then goes downhill towards 15. When the path comes to a lane (Stroud a hedge in front of some houses, turn left. At next junction bear right on footpath. Follow footpath signs to road.
- 12. Cross the road and carry straight on through disused car park. Before turning right onto the Greensand Way by the viewpoint, take a short detour left to the small shelter (see picture, left - "A shelter of cedar shingles that captured the thoughts and memories of visitors") and then retrace your steps.

- We now follow the Greensand Way (marked GW) nearly all the way back to Shamley Green.
- 13. When entering car park, turn left and follow path down steps and across the road (left then right). Path goes gradually turn hill. Follow GW at each junction.
- 14. Path goes between line of gorse bushes and into a field. Continue downhill and go to the right of the lake.
- Lane), turn right onto the lane and then left in 100m on footpath.
- 16. As you approach the road, turn left following the GW sign - there will be a line of trees on your left.
- 17. Where a footpath (GW) goes left, continue on the path straight ahead. This will take you through a kissing gate, between some gardens and back to Shamley Green.

Munstead Wood

In April 2023 the National Trust purchased Munstead Wood - the Grade-I listed home and garden of garden designer Gertrude Jekyll located between Brighton Road, Munstead Heath Road and Heath Lane.

The National Trust is keen to get the views of local people on how to make best use of this historic house and garden, and to keep us informed of developments. Consequently, I was invited along with a number of other local people to one of a series of events held in January.

Gertrude Jekyll's house and garden occupied 15 acres, and the National Trust has now been able to buy 11 acres of the original estate. Unusually, not only is the house grade 1 listed, but the garden is a grade 1 registered landscape. This, combined with the importance of Gertrude Jekyll and Edwin Lutyens made the purchase a fantastic opportunity for the National Trust. Even in January, the garden is a quiet and beautiful oasis and will be a wonderful place to visit.

Gertrude Jekyll (buried in the graveyard of Busbridge Church) is one of Godalming's most famous residents and has been featured several times in The Bridge magazine - see for example Katy Bennett's article in the May / June 2023 edition. Jekyll is best known now for her influence on garden design in Britain and worldwide in the late Victorian and Edwardian period, but she was also a successful business woman and artist. She wrote 14 books and more than 1000 articles Munstead Wood was also her first collaboration with Edwin Lutyens, who was also local having grown up in Thursley. Lutyens designed the War memorial and also the chancel screen in Busbridge church.

The house design was greatly influenced by the Arts and Crafts movement and retains many of the original features (though none of the furniture).

In the garden some of Gertrude Jekyll's original design had been lost, but work had been undertaken by the previous owners to restore the original design which had been meticulously documented by Gertrude Jekyll. Some of our readers will remember visiting Munstead Wood in the late 1990s when it was open to the public as part of the

National Garden Scheme. The formal
paths, walls and pond near the house,
designed for Jekyll by Edwin Lutyens,
remain largely intact, and Jekyll's
innovative rock garden was discovered
in the 1990s buried under layers of
garden debris.

Work now continues on the garden and the National Trust are working with Munstead Wood's neighbours to work out how to manage access for visitors to this beautiful and unique site. There is no date yet for when it will be open to the public, but in time the Trust will be recruiting staff and volunteers. Further updates will

Easter Biscuits by Elizabeth Silver

These classic Easter biscuits originate from Somerset in the West Country and were given as gifts at Easter time.

Traditionally flavoured with Cassia oil, which was thought to have been the oil used to embalm Christ's body before he was laid in the tomb and which has a flavour similar to cinnamon (used here) they are delightfully crisp with a delicate spicy taste and a warm, golden glow from the saffron.

INGREDIENTS

100g butter, softened

1 medium egg, separated

75g caster sugar

100g plain flour Pinch of salt

1 tsp cinnamon 50g currants

Pinch of ground

saffron mixed with 2 tbsps of brandy or milk Caster sugar to dredge

Makes 12

- 1. Preheat oven to 200°C. Grease 2 baking trays.
- 2. Cream together the butter and sugar until pale and fluffy, beat in the egg yolk.
- 3. Fold in the flour, salt, spices, currants and saffron liquid to form a fairly soft dough.
- 4. Knead lightly on a floured surface and roll out thinly.
- 5. Using a 7.5cm fluted cutter, cut into rounds and re roll where necessary.
- 6. Place on the baking trays and bake for 8 minutes. Remove and brush each biscuit with the remaining egg white and dredge with caster sugar.
- 7. Bake for a further 3 minutes until golden brown. Cool on a wire rack.

The Merry Harriers

What a treat it was to visit The Merry Harriers in early January. Having been taken over by the culinary team behind Hilltop Kitchen in November last year, we were keen to pop along for lunch to celebrate our wedding anniversary.

Since opening Hilltop Kitchen in 2021, seasonal cooking with locally sourced, high-quality ingredients has been the cornerstone of Alex and Sam's food philosophy; and we enjoyed a glass of Sparkling Fumé from Greyfriars Vineyard in Puttenham, as we looked over the menu.

To start, I opted for the roast beetroot with candied walnuts, goat's cheese and bitter leaves (£10) whilst Mark went for a retro prawn cocktail revamped with Kennet crayfish, smoked salmon & trout roe (£14). For our main, we opted for the 'To Share' option of the chicken & ham hock pie which came with buttery greens and the most deliciously crispy potatoes I've eaten in a long time. At £45 to share, it wasn't the cheapest option on the menu (most are priced between £16-18) but it was certainly tasty and the pie itself generous.

For dessert we both chose the





Jamaican ginger sticky toffee pudding with whisky toffee sauce (£8.50). Quite often we will share a dessert; however, from the first mouthfuls, there was no regret in ordering one each; it was scrumptious, unctuous and every other hyperbole you'd expect from a sticky toffee pud in winter. With coffee, it was the perfect finish.

Eating out, even in pubs, is generally quite expensive these days and whilst The Merry Harriers is no exception, for the quality of the ingredients, great cooking and warm hospitality, we thought it was well worth it.

The Merry Harriers serves food 6-8.30pm Wednesday, 12-2.30pm & 6-8.30pm Thursday- Saturday; 12-5.30pm Sunday. Closed on Monday & Tuesday.






