## St Mark's GODALMING FOODBANK

A helping hand in hard times

The continuing coronavirus pandemic has caused varying degrees of economic hardship and dislocation for many local families, for reasons including redundancy, health issues and benefit problems. In this difficult time lots of people have found themselves in a position they never dreamt of and have used foodbanks for occasional help as a stop gap measure while issues are sorted out.

St. Mark's Godalming Foodbank is a local example and opened in a very small way with one cupboard in December 2010. We have grown over the years and now have 2 cupboards, a small storage room and part use of a shed, with another shed for our sole use arriving soon.

I have been involved from the start, and for the past year my colleague Ricky has been helping out, and we also have some very loyal volunteers. It gives me huge pleasure to know I am helping people. Some years ago when my children were small, I was in a position similar to that which many of our recipients find themselves in, and I wish there had been somewhere like St. Mark's to help me. I think I understand better than most how hard these situations can be.

In terms of the numbers of people we help, we went from about 25 a month previous to lock down, then rocketed to approximately 250 during April and May.

The numbers have slowly reduced since then until we have levelled out at approximately 55 since the end of August.

We have outreach sites which take parcels to dispatch to needy people, such the site at the Baptist Church which is operating from the home of one of our volunteers. We post needs monthly on our website (<a href="www.parishofgodalming.org.uk/our-church-of-st-marks/food-bank/">www.parishofgodalming.org.uk/our-church-of-st-marks/food-bank/</a>) and have always been supported by local churches and our regular donors. Harvest festivals also bring a great many donations from schools and churches. Waitrose in Godalming have also been supporting us by collecting in the shop for many years now. With Christmas on the horizon, we are planning some hampers with the help of Churches Together in Godalming, but have always popped some Christmas "goodies" into the December parcels.

We work in close liaison with the Community Store at the Wilfred Noyce centre, where our contact is Patrick Andre. He keeps in regular touch and we will help with anything they need and vice versa. Patrick has raised funds for our new shed, which we hope to get up and running very soon.



## Comfort and Joy.... Good news, really?

In a 2003 film of this name character Jane Berry has a car crash and ends up in a parallel world. She finds she has a new way of being who she is. In her former world Jane had everything; a great life and a significant job; she lived well. Then a change impacts her. She doesn't quite understand it; she's in shock at the difference; and although she tries, she cannot revert to the old way of being.

Perhaps you're in a parallel place right now? None of us expected it this time last year. I'd just come back from a fact-finding trip to Bosnia and I had so many great plans.... or so I thought. I'd never heard of COVID.

In our parallel place I have a hope for December 2020 in Busbridge and nearby; that it is a time where each of us spreads a small dose of comfort and joy and in such measure that it alters the framework of our area for good. I hope we'll see comfort and joy in conversations and in people passing one another on The Drive, hear it on the Rec and at the station. In my hope I see it making a difference as it releases us from fear, uncertainty & being sapped of energy.

In the film, Jane explores her new world and comes to appreciate that she needs to make the best of today. She discovers that old clothes can be better than always having the newest; volunteering at a homeless shelter brings greater meaning than things she used to do; and that the new friends and family she has discovered need to be treasured because they may not be with her for ever.

How does Christmas bring comfort and joy into this?

It's about living now, not waiting for the past to return or for an unknown future. What is the difference between joy and happiness? Happiness is fleeting. Joy is much deeper and comes from being rooted in something good. Christmas is about discovering (or rediscovering) the Comfort of Christ with us; and the joy of finding this brings meaning. Christmas for me is about God who walks through things with us; is within the mess we are in; and brings joy in the midst of shifting circumstances that seem so confusing. We can all find reasons for comfort and joy, some small and every day, while others are more significant. We can all bring comfort to others. Being a person of comfort and joy is a decision and it is one that isn't taken lightly, but when walked it lightens our lives.

This is the message we'll be exploring through Christmas at Busbridge Church. We're going to offer some fantastically creative things for the whole community as a way to bring us all together and offer one another comfort and joy in hard times, including a great art

exhibition to help us think about bigger meaning. And you can catch our services on our YouTube channel and other Christmas events (all COVID secure) will be announced on our website. But above all, in a time of difference and a parallel place, we're still here: willing, wanting to serve and praying for everyone and this area.

## Fröhliche Weihnachten!

What might you find under a German Christmas tree?

Whatever age or gender the recipient, there will probably be a Weihnachtsteller, a 'Christmas plate' filled with a variety of biscuits special to the Christmas season.

In a 'good year', my mother might bake 15 different kinds of biscuits. Production would start at the beginning of December, and gradually we would see a collection of tins filling one of the shelves in the cellar which acted as a pantry.

We all had our favourites, and here are the recipes for two of mine. A Spitzbube is a scoundrel or scallywag – I've no idea how this rogue gave his name to an almondy-buttery shortbread type of confectionery, but he did.

#### SPITZBUBEN



#### Method

- Beat the butter with the sugar until smooth and creamy.
- Add egg yolk & vanilla, then the almonds, and finally the flour, kneading quickly into a smooth

pastry. If it is sticky, put in the fridge for 30 minutes, or add a little more flour.

- Roll out to a thickness of 3-4mm, cut round biscuits and bake at 170-180°C for about 10 minutes – you want them barely browned.
- Warm some redcurrant jelly and use this to sandwich the biscuits together in pairs. Dust with icing sugar. They will taste better on the second day, or the third, if they get the chance.

#### Ingredients

120g iring sugar
1 egg yolk
½ vanilla pod, or ½ tsp
vanilla bean paste
100g ground almonds
200-250g plain flour
Redcurrant jelly (or
another red jelly, or
seedless red jam. You
want it to have a bit of a
tang)
Icing sugar to dust

And if you are wondering what to do with the leftover egg white, make.....





- Beat the egg white until peaky and fold in other ingredients gradually (quantities shown are per 1 egg white).
  - Use two teaspoons to put small heaps of the mixture, well spaced, onto a greased and floured baking sheet.
- Bake at 100°C for 40-50 minutes or until done, very lightly brown, but not runny in the middle. They should end up crunchy on the outside & soft on the inside.
  - They will be delicious straight from the oven but keep in a tin for a few weeks.

#### GLÖGG



Glögg is a hot, sweet, delicious red wine drink to be had in the lead up to Christmas. It's best enjoyed with almonds, raisins & Swedish pepper cookies. You can buy Anna's pepper cookies or if you're into baking, buy the readymade cookie dough from the Scandi Kitchen from Ocado and make traditional goats, stars and hearts!

Ingredients
1 litre red wine
3 cinnamon sticks
1 tsp whole cardamom pods
10 whole cloves

3 star anises 80g caster sugar

- Pour the wine into a pan and mix in all the spices. Add the sugar and stir until it has dissolved. Make sure the mix is simmering, it is not allowed to boil.
- Lower the heat and let the wine simmer for about 15 minutes. Pour the Glögg into a bottle or carafe and leave it to brew for at least 2 hours, but preferably over night. Remove the spices with a sieve, reheat carefully and serve warm, but not hot together with blanched almonds and raisins.

You go out to your allotment as it's the only place you can go as you can't leave your village. It's the only food you can eat. BUT.. there are unexploded bombs beneath the ground.

FICTION?? No—you live in Laos. The most bombed country in the world per capita. Where?! Laos is a country between Thailand

& Vietnam.
It was neutral during the

Vietnam War (known in SE Asia as the American War) but the Communists used paths and tracks through Laos to move troops and materials to South Vietnam. So the Americans bombed it in a secret war. They used cluster bombs, each large shell containing 680 bomblets which can kill or maim people over an area the size of six football pitches. About a third of them did not explode on hitting the ground. There are 80 million bomblets still there.



Over 20,000 people have been killed and many more injured since the end of the war. The bomblets, each the size of a cricket ball, are in the ground and explode if hit by a spade or stick, or disturbed by a child picking one up or heated if a fire is started above them

BUT...your field is now clear of bombs....because the Mine Advisory Group (MAG) have been working there and have just announced the area around your village has been cleared. Just in time ..as lockdown is being announced, so THIS year for the first time since 1973 you can work in your field without the fear of being blown up.

Glad you live in Godalming? If you are, how about supporting the work of MAG?


year. That was pre-Covid which alas means we cannot sell at the usual local Christmas Fairs this year.


