




This wonderful photo of a sparrow hawk was captured in Minster Road by local resident, Higgs Wood. The hawk obligingly posed on the



bird feeder for some minutes and Higgs was able to photograph it through the window. The 'little' birds (their favourite diet, along with pigeons it would seem) were nowhere to be seen, sensibly cowering in the bushes! You can clearly see its wonderful yellow talons and striking chevrons of its chestnut chest feathers. Apparently they have a life span of around 4 years, which seems surprisingly short. And with age, its eyes change colour, going from a bold yellow to a deeper orange, and even red!





Last issue we shared the news that work had started to convert the Busbridge Church Centre

to a café for church activities, local community and passers by. Interest in the café, and response to an ad for a Café Manager has been great, and the café management team is hoping to have the right people and volunteers ready for the café opening in early 2022. As with many building projects there have been delays; most critically we await the new windows and other fundamental fixtures and fittings (18 weeks for the comfy sofas!) The café management team is confident it will be worth the wait! The Yew Tree Café (named for the surrounding trees in the churchyard) is not for profit, and will serve barista coffee, light lunches, snacks and beverages. Sport For All MUGA PROJECT

I Made This Crafts

Resilience through a lockdown
Claire, who owns the I Made This craft shop in Church St, writes
about her experience

When the lockdown hit in March 2020, like most businesses, I panicked, especially as I am a sole trader. I locked the front door of my little shop that I have put my heart and soul into, not knowing what its future would be. I was heartbroken.

Before I closed my shop, I brought my sewing machine and some fabrics home so I could do some projects to keep me busy. I started to make some face masks for friends and family, then a student contacted me and asked if I could make some masks for the Oncology Department at the Royal Surrey, as masks were like gold dust in hospitals. I roped in as many students as I could to help me and I personally made about 200 masks. I also donated masks to The Meath and various other charities.

After doing that, I felt it was time to start work again and I advertised on social media to say I was making masks. The response was amazing and the orders kept streaming in. Masks were being worn more and more often, even before we were told to, and early on in the pandemic, no shops were selling them. So, when I saw a gap in the market, I went for it. I posted the masks to customers until my shop was allowed to re-open and then, I actually had people queuing outside my shop. So, from April to at least September, my sewing machine was in daily use.

Crafts started to become very popular over lockdown as they were fun and something to do on your own or with the family. At one point, you couldn't get hold of sewing machines, and thin elastic trebled in price as many people then started making masks. I am a firm believer that crafts are essential for your



health and wellbeing; for me, crafts are my therapy.

Since the pandemic, my classes have increased in size as so many people have started to sew and want to learn more. Tutoring sewing to both adults and children keeps me busy, and since I reopened, I now sell a large range of fabrics and sewing patterns as well as haberdashery. Who would have thought a little sewing shop would thrive and survive through a worldwide pandemic!

Ed and I were in town recently and as it had started to rain and was nearing lunchtime, being illogical, we went to have a "Breakfast pot" in the Godalming Deli, at 101 High Street, near the Pepperpot. Not only was it almost a "full English", with organic baked beans, local sausage, egg and scrumptiously thick crispy bacon, but served

on a bed of spinach and extremely good value at £6.50. It certainly kept us going on the climb back up the steps to Butts Lane and home.




We were impressed with the rest of the menu which also had vegetarian options with dishes including Deli-made sauces and hummus, avocado, tomato and locally-baked bread. In fact the policy of the Godalming Deli is to source as many as possible of its simple but high quality products and ingredients from the local area. There is a map of Surrey on the wall which indicates the locations of producers and suppliers, such as the Godalming Food Company, the Fine Cheese Company, Crosbie's Savoury Tarts of Wormley and the Hogs Back Brewery.

At the back of the shop is a "Zero Waste" area – a refill station where one can fill up one's own containers with grains, nuts, cereals, pasta, dried fruit, spices et al, which are bought in bulk in returnable, reusable or

recyclable containers. And the shelves are full of most tempting goodies that would make lovely treats for oneself or presents for others – chorizo, salami, jams, chutneys and honey, chocolates, crisps, biscuits, wines, soft drinks and local gin.

How about choosing items to put into a gift hamper for someone's birthday or Christmas?





Ichthus is the youth group at Busbridge and Hambledon Church for youth ages 15 to 18, and is open to all youth. At Ichthus we grow closer to God through social activities and good conversations. Today I want to tell you a bit more about the few traditional things that happen at Ichthus during the Advent and Christmas season.

One knows Christmas is around the corner when Ichthus goes on a special outing at the end of November: ice-skating at Hampton Court Palace. It is a temporary ice-skating rink that opens between November and January right in front of the palace itself.



Another Ichthus Christmas event is decorating the inside of Busbridge church (top, opposite page). For one evening, all the Ichthus youth (with the help of some brave church volunteers) put garlands, tinsel, and other Christmas decorations on the walls of the church. I am not sure who started this tradition, but it was not very wise to ask a group of teenagers to decorate the church. The last time we did it, in



2019, it was such a disaster that some adults had to completely redecorate the Christmas tree! But it is great fun for the youth to be involved with the Christmas decorations in that way, and in the end it is an excellent team building exercise. When I



asked Toby, an Ichthus alumni now student at the University of Cardiff, what he remembered about the Christmas decorations he told me, "It was such fun to stand on my friend's shoulders to get all the fairy lights up". Not sure why Toby didn't use a ladder!

The final act in a traditional Ichthus Christmas happens on Christmas Eve. That night, at about 8PM, all the Ichthus youth gather together for a little celebration. For this special occasion the dress code is black tie, so no sweaters or baggy pants

allowed! We play lots of Christmas games, listen to a whole playlist of Christmas songs, and eat a potluck-style dinner. It is a great celebration. At the end of the dinner, everyone heads off to Busbridge church for the midnight carol service. This last service before Christmas Day is quite formal, so we all fit perfectly wearing suits and dresses!

The UPSIDE of LOCKDOWN

We didn't see the pandemic coming but the positive people amongst all communities found ways around the many challenges it posed or learnt to adjust as best they could. Often that was by helping others with food runs, Food Banks, prescription collections, keeping in touch (safely) with neighbours and friends to help keep up spirits. I don't recall there having been so many people at one time being so innovative. Communities certainly rose to the challenge and we should be full of admiration for their efforts.



For Sandra and me, Lockdown was just that because of being high risk following my lung transplant (7 years ago now). The furthest we travelled was to the end of the drive to clap the amazing NHS on a Thursday evening with our Busbridge neighbours and how emotional was that! As you will no doubt understand, we have a strong affinity with the NHS and, as some of you will know, have been making wooden snowmen and reindeer in recent years to raise money for The **Harefield Transplant Hospital**. In the January just before Covid reared its ugly head we'd promised the hospital that we would raise a minimum of £2000 in the coming year, an increase on £1535 of the previous Christmas. We thought, "Make a few more, sell a few more and £2000 shouldn't be a problem." Ooops!

Lockdown meant no Christmas Fairs, no access to wood to make our snowmen & reindeer because we were indoors 24/7 and we'd promised £2000. To cut a long story short, we had an incredible success all round due to human kindness, ingenuity and teamwork in a time of great adversity which was reflected across so many communities. As for the £2000 target, we'd passed that by mid November. All the BYO Snowmen had sold out by then too. The final sum received by the hospital was beyond our wildest dreams. £9099.78.

We have no idea what this Christmas will bring but we have plenty of our "Made by us", Identically Different Snowmen and Reindeer. The website has been upgraded by our web man with a new, shorter domain name that is really relevant and easy to remember –

It has online ordering just like Amazon & Ebay etc, so it couldn't be easier. The reindeer are fully house trained and don't moult whilst the Snowmen don't melt. They need new homes for Christmas and are available now. New this year are the BYO Reindeer aimed at 8+. (No nails or screws, just wooden pegs and non toxic PVA glue).

A quick and easy craft idea for the children





Use more icing to create a snowy roof and decorate with sweets of your choosing. Gummy bears make fun little 'people'.




Take 3 'well known' rectangular biscuits (morning coffee biscuits work well too). Prepare some *stiff* icing; add some icing sugar to a bowl, slowly adding one teaspoon of water at a time & mix into a very **thick** paste that doesn't drip easily.



Using a teaspoon carefully spread the icing along the long edges of a biscuit, chocolate facing outwards. Place two more biscuits (as 4) to form a 'triangle' or little house, joining the top with icing too.



INGREDIENTS

750g ripe plums, rinsed and roughly chopped, stones left in 1 cinnamon stick 1 star anise Juice of 2 lemons 500g sugar 1 tsp powdered pectin Granulated sugar for rolling



Ruby Red Spiced Sugar Plum JELLIES

These festive little jellies make perfect Christmas presents. The recipe is made on the hob and poured into a tin to set. Use black or deep red plums for a wonderfully rich colour. Makes 36.

- **1** Line a square baking tin with greaseproof paper or a greaseproof liner, making sure there are no gaps.
- **2** Place the plums, spices and 5 tablespoons of water in a heavy saucepan. Bring to a gentle simmer, then cook for 20-25 minutes, stirring frequently until soft and mushy. Pour the plums into a sieve over a bowl, and discard the spices. Using the back of a spoon, push the pulp through the sieve. Continue until only the stones and skin are left, which you can then discard.
- **3** Pour the juice back into the saucepan and add the lemon juice, sugar, and powdered pectin. Heat gently, stirring until the sugar and pectin has dissolved, then bring to a fast boil, stirring frequently (be careful as it may spit and will be very hot) for 12-15 minutes until it thickens. It's ready when you can draw a spoon across the bottom of the pan and the jelly doesn't immediately rush to fill the gap. Pour the jelly into the lined tin, and allow to cool before placing in the fridge to set overnight.
- 4 If you are dusting your jellies with sugar, cut six even strips across the tin, and six in the opposite direction, so that you have 36 small cubes. Pour a thin layer of granulated sugar into a shallow bowl and toss the jellies in the sugar so they have a thin dusting on each side. The jellies will absorb the sugar, so only dust the amount you want to use straight away. Wrap the rest in greaseproof paper and refrigerate. If you are using the jelly as an accompaniment to cheese wrap in greaseproof paper or cling film. They will keep happily in the fridge for ages, thanks to the sugar content.

Beginner's Pink COCONUT ICE with Pistachios


Adding rose water to a soft pink layer of coconut ice and scattering over a handful of pale green, pistachios quickly elevates this simple recipe into a grown-up treat. Makes 25 squares.

- 1 Line a square tin with greaseproof paper. Sprinkle the chopped pistachio nuts over the paper in the base of the tin. Mix the sieved icing sugar in a large bowl with the condensed milk, lemon juice and rose essence. Stir in the coconut and beat the mixture, which will quickly start to stiffen.
- **2** As soon as the coconut is mixed in, remove half the mixture and smooth it into the tin, using the back of a spoon. If you are finding it very sticky or difficult to flatten, lay a sheet of cling film over the coconut ice, and press down with something flat and square, such as the bottom of a box or plastic container.
- **3** Return to the remaining coconut ice and add a few drops of red food colouring little by little, until you get a gentle pastel pink, Tip the pink coconut ice on top of the white and smooth down as before, again using a sheet of cling film over the top if you need to. Place in the fridge for at least four hours, but preferably overnight. Cut into squares and keep in an airtight container if you are not eating immediately.



INGREDIENTS

1-2 tbsp finely chopped unsalted pistachio nuts
400g sieved icing sugar
397g tin condensed milk
2 tsp lemon juice
400g desiccated coconut
1-3 drops red food colouring

provided sweaters of high quality to well-known people such as George Mallory the mountaineer, England cricket teams and royalty. 
