Message from the Chair

All of our church communities have our own stories. Even the most venerable of us came into existence at some specific time, and though the actual details might only be recoverable by archaeologists, there's a story to be told, and younger churches will be well aware of the circumstances that brought them into being. We'll all have a narrative of the ministers who have served our community (at least within living memory), some of the people who have been part of it, and the changes it's undergone. These stories affect our communities even if, as individuals, we might not be very familiar with them, because they will have shaped the way they've developed and the situations we who are part of them now have inherited.

The story we all share, whatever our differences, is that of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and ultimately our smaller stories are of course less cosmically important than his. But in order to be truthful and genuine servants of Christ within our own contexts we have to bring his story together with ours and allow the one to affect the other.

Hopefully our stories will be ones of at least trying to be faithful witnesses across the decades, and maybe centuries if they're long enough. But we know that we will almost certainly have made mistakes and taken wrong turns. What does the narrative of Easter, of dying and rising, mean for us in our own particular contexts? What will we have to die to and rise to? What has to be left behind, and what embraced or rediscovered? Allowing our church communities to be shaped by the story of Jesus Christ is about this as much as anything.

The aim is to reach a target of 6,800km, which is the distance from Godalming to Monrovia in Liberia. Fishermen in this area can spend 16 hours out fishing for food only to return with empty nets; our walk aims to raise £2,000 to equip them with tools and resources (such as life jackets and GPS tracking systems) to enable them to fish effectively.
