


Funding agreed to secure clergy at St Peter & St Paul's, St Mark's and Hambledon Further investment for the transition process and enhancing ministries and ministry posts.

Considerations

Evaluated by the six working groups which fed into the Steering Group over 6 months.



Worship

Sunday Services Locations, styles and patterns

Identifying the best pattern of services across four churches whilst still preserving individual congregational identity and worship style.



Clergy

Focusing on Mission and how a Minster could reach out in love to all in Godalming, Busbridge and Hambledon; support clergy wellbeing, pastoral care and overall resourcing.



Specific Age Ministries

How would the Minster affect youth and children's ministries across Godalming. Logistics, locations, staff, leaders and other resources.



Buildings & Property

Looked at how existing properties could be best used or leveraged to meet ministry needs



Finance & Affordability

Looked at the likely costs of joining and expanding the mission against the investment.



Operations & Admin

How would the Minster run efficiently and effectively

Analysed by 46+ people over 12 months

3 PCCs

The PCCs met several times to deliberate on and test the Steering Group's evaluation and proposal before voting in favour on 11 July.

This means the proposal can be presented to the members of the Electoral Rolls to vote.
